Coverage of materials varies by section. Near-comprehensive coverage is provided for available ANC materials, (Section 2). However, only the most important articles from SECHABA, the official ANC Journal, are listed separately.

In all other cases, published materials from the 1960s to the present have been included, with near-comprehensive coverage of English language materials for the 1970s, including African

imprints. A number of East and West European and Soviet materials are also listed. Citations in section 1: General reference works, are annotated, except in a few cases for works that have not actually been seen. In those cases, annotations by other authors, where available, have been given or appropriate explanations made. Arrangement is alphabetical except where otherwise noted.

The bibliography was compiled at the Indiana University Library in Bloomington, Indiana. The Library has an extensive Africana collection. However, materials listed are not necessarily held in the collection.

Mr. David Easterman of Indiana University Library and Mir. Mokubung Nkomo of the ANC gave invaluable advice on the preparation of the project.

This is a list of all acquisitions by Southern African

libraries which have been reported to the State Library, published in three series: by title author, and International Standard Book Number (ISBN). It updates the Joint Catalogue of Monographs published by the State Library in 1975 which consists of 2139 microfiches covering 1,283,419 monographs. From Musiker, 1979, see number 39 above.

quarterly with annual cumulations.

Comprehensively lists South African publications arranged by Dewey Decimal Classification with an author and title index.

The State Library is putting all newspapers on microfilm not already so preserved. This is a list of about 100 titles with full bibliographic information, holdings records, and prices. Each record includes an historical summary in English and sometimes in the language of the papers, but not in African languages. North American and British holdings are included.
